

- Brother Walt Thompson (T 747, BS 1978, MA 1979) who served as High Alpha (1977-1978) has recently been elected President of the American College of Sports Medicine (ACSM). ACSM is the world's largest sports medicine and exercise science professional organization with over 50,000 members, student members, and certified health fitness professionals. He will be installed as the President at ACSM's Annual Meeting to be held in Denver (June 2017). After receiving a PHD from The Ohio State University in 1983, Brother Thompson held positions at Swedish Covenant Hospital in Chicago, then professor at the University of Southern Mississippi, and for the past 22 years at Georgia State University in Atlanta where he is now a Regents' Professor and Associate Dean for Graduate Studies and Research in the College of Education & Human Development. While at Wake Forest, Brother Thompson was an Exercise Science major and was twice named the Most Valuable Player on the WFU Demon Deacon Track & Field team.
