	The chapter's period of probation will end no sooner than May 2019 (Commencement).
	<p>An Alumni Advisory Board (AAB) will be established in conjunction with the assistance of International Headquarters (IHQ). The AAB will commit to the following:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Individual mentorship of each member of the executive board that will include at least weekly communication in person/phone/Skype. 2. A least one advisor will be in attendance at each chapter event. 3. At least one advisor will be in attendance at each executive board meeting. 4. Submission of a once a month summary of the chapter's progress to the International Headquarters and Wake Forest during the probationary period.

	The chapter must complete an Executive Committee training and host a "mock" Executive Committee meeting and hearing during the Fall 2017 semester.
	The chapter will be responsible for creating and implementing a new Harm Reduction Education program regarding Alcohol Safety for the Spring 2018 semester. Before implementation can happen the chapter must have the program approved by the International Headquarters. The chapter will be responsible for coordinating due dates with the Associate Director of Harm Reduction (abennett@lambdachi.org). The chapter needs to begin working with Alyssa immediately on this initiative.
	<p>The chapter will submit a complete calendar of events for the Fall 2016 and Spring 2017 semesters. Due dates are as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Fall 2017: May 5, 2017

	The chapter must send a minimum of 3 representatives to the 2017 Stead Leadership Seminar.
	The High Alpha (Chapter President) must attend the High Alpha Summit in 2018, in Indianapolis, Indiana. The chapter is responsible for monitoring communication from IHQ regarding dates and location.
	The chapter must submit a letter to the Director of Chapter Services (nzuniga@lambdachi.org) upon completion of all terms to be removed from probation.

Status	Terms from Wake Forest
	Deferred Suspension from March 29, 2017 through May 21, 2018. (Definition of status is outlined in Wake Forest's letter.)
	Probation from May 22, 2018 through Commencement 2019. (Definition of status is outlined in Wake Forest's letter.)
	No social events of any kind will be permitted by the chapter from March 29, 2017 through May 15, 2017. Social events may resume after May 15, 2017.
	No more than two events with alcohol may be held during the Fall 2017 term. These events cannot take place before October 1, 2017 and must be held at University venues, such as your lounge or a Department of Athletics tailgate.
	No more than four events with alcohol may be held during the Spring 2018 term.
