The State of the Chapter

Brothers,

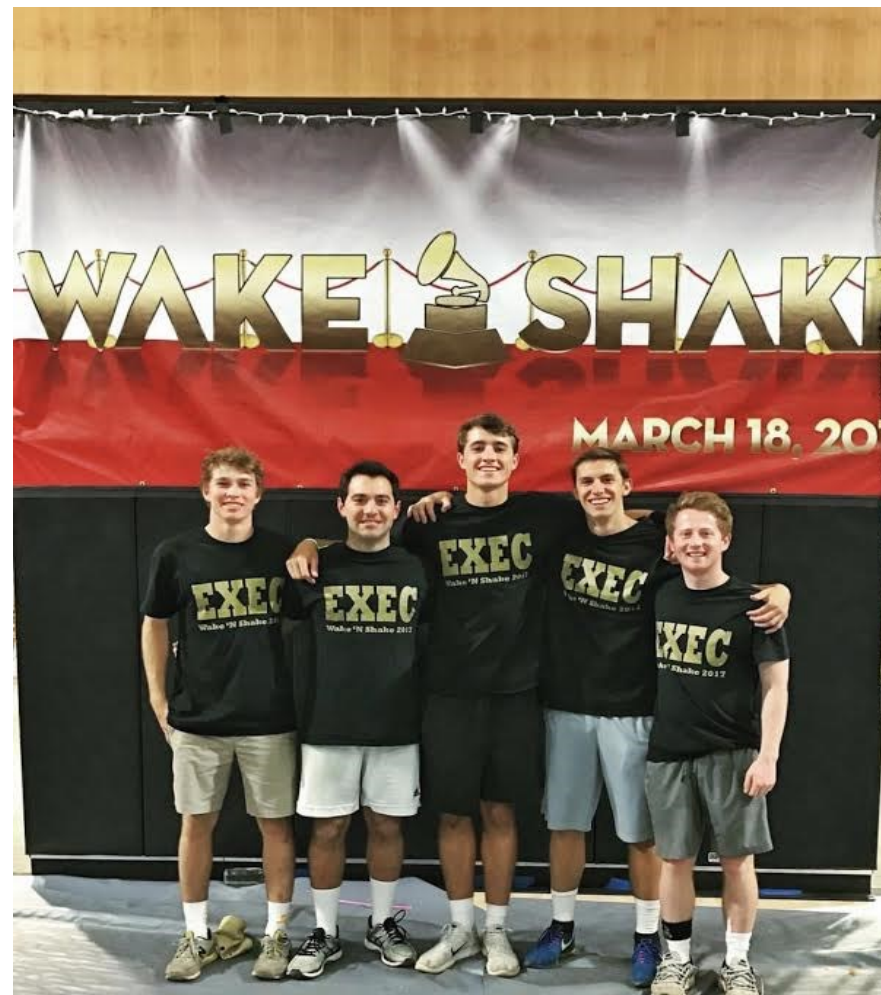
It is with warm regards that I write to you to update you on the state of the Theta-Tau chapter of Lambda Chi Alpha. I was elected the chapter's High Alpha at the beginning of December 2016, along with a great Executive Board and High Zeta. We entered our positions in a difficult time, as the chapter was still facing sanctions from an event held in September 2016.

In the middle of January 2017, there were a series of unfortunate circumstances that occurred during a few of our events, and those happenings led us to another investigation. During that same time period, the school's administration was investigating other fraternities for similar circumstances, and our investigation was extended until the end of March. A week after the March hearing, we were found to have broken our probationary terms from the incident in September 2016. We received sanctions from both Wake Forest and fraternity's International Headquarters, who were working closely with each other on the investigation. Despite all the hardship the previous two semesters, we continue to have many very impressive achievements, if I may say so myself. To start, we initiated 17 new members into our brotherhood. In their new member education, they contributed hundreds of community services hours alongside initiated brothers to the Winston-Salem community. I know these 17 have what it takes to become great brothers of Lambda Chi Alpha. Theta-Tau also continued its tradition of holding the highest GPA on campus with a combined 3.36, and we had 36 brothers make Dean's List. Another great tradition we have is an overwhelming amount of representation on Wake 'N Shake's (the school's largest student-led event) Executive Board. This year we had 5 brothers hold a position on the board, with former High Alpha, Michael Hanamirian, as an overall Co-Chair. Not only did we have leadership within Wake 'N

I truly believe that Wake Forest is cracking down on fraternity life.

As of November 19th, 2016, Zac is commissioned as a Second Lieutenant in the United States Marine Corps, making him a third generation serviceman. For those of us that know Zac, we know how long he has wanted such an esteemed position, how hard he has worked, and how many obstacles he was able to overcome to be where he is today, serving our nation with honor.

Despite a few physical setbacks, including an ankle surgery that rendered him handicapped for a short period of time, and a deference of his dream for a little over a year after graduating from Wake Forest, Zac kept up his attitude and determination, and was admitted to Officer Candidate School in Quantico, VA in September of 2016. He spent the next 10 weeks in a grueling training course, that over half of the candidates in his class were dismissed from. But he passed with flying colors, and scored an exceedingly high score on his exit exams.

Now that his commissioning is complete, Zac has returned to Quantico for six months of infantry school, which he is expected to graduate from in June of this year. Excluding all of the long days, late nights, and physical pain, his social media pages show him tossing grenades, firing off M2 .50 caliber machine guns, and MK19 grenade launchers - if only we could be so lucky! There is no other job like it in this country.

From infantry school, he hopes to continue on to flight school in his home state of Florida. The good Lord, Wake Forest, and Lambda Chi Alpha have blessed us with men like Zac who continue to protect our land, sea and sky on behalf of freedom and democracy. So I hope you will join me in prayer and supplication that He will continue to protect Zac in all his endeavors, both foreign and domestic, in years to come.
